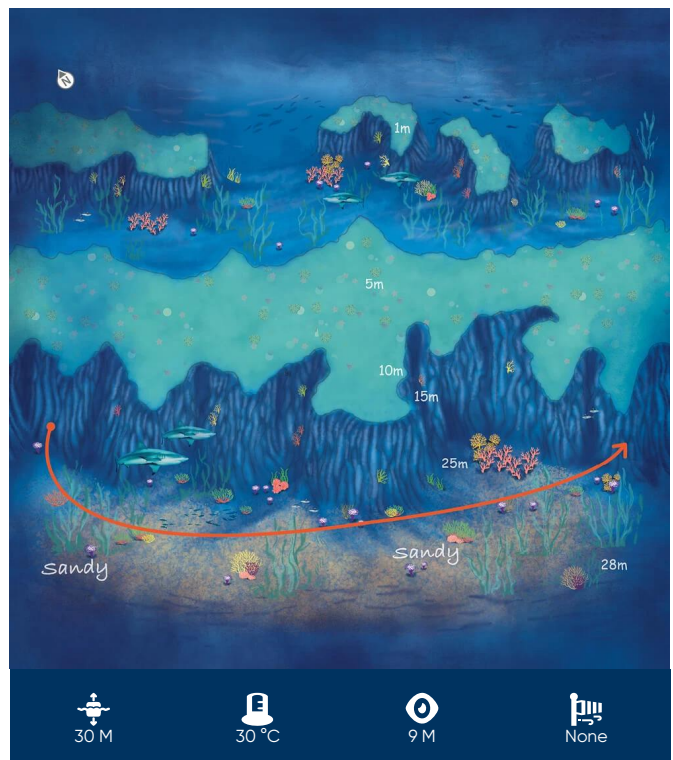

Nestled within the idyllic Farasan archipelago, Al Hussain reef offers a wanderlust paradise, combining a magnificent drop off, stunning marine environment and thrilling chance encounters with sharks. Experienced divers can explore the reef's incredible depths, which plunge down to 25m, while snorkellers can glide along the wall ledge and marvel at the vibrant explosion of colour that lies just beneath the surface.

The aquatic marine life here knows no bounds and the warm coastal waters attract a variety of parrotfish, butterflyfish and pufferfish. Red Sea tobies are particularly prevalent within the sandy flats and despite being easy to spot with their dark brown appearance and prominent blue spots, these agile puffers are practically impossible to photograph. Reef sharks are in abundance and those venturing into the turquoise waters in April and May might even spot a migrating whale shark. Although rare, these gentle giants occasionally visit the outer reef slopes offering an unparalleled experience for nearby swimmers.

The soft and hard corals at Al Hussain reef are equally striking. Lavender-coloured finger corals rise up between the rocks to form tables, sheltering sea cucumbers and needle-spine
